

ADMISSION OF EXCHANGE AND FOREIGN STUDENTS

Qualified international students may enroll in and attend school consistent with applicable federal and state laws.

Students who possess F-1 immigrant status will be affected by the following regulations:

- Prohibits their attendance in public elementary schools (grades pre-K through 8) or publicly funded adult education programs;
- Limits their attendance in public secondary schools (grades 9 through 12) to a maximum of 12 months; and
- Requires them to reimburse public secondary schools for the full, unsubsidized per capita cost of education as determined by the Department of Education for the intended period of study.

Students possessing other forms of immigrant status will be considered on an individual basis.

A certificate of attendance will be awarded to any foreign student attending Franklin High School. The certificate will include the student's name and dates of attendance, and will be signed by the Superintendent of Schools, the Director of Curriculum and Instruction and the Building Principal.

A record of the academic course of study will be completed and issued with the certificate. This will include subjects taken, grades, units of credit, length of class periods, number of periods per week, and the student's performance as evaluated by the teacher. This dated record will also include a definition of grades and carry the official seal of the Franklin Public Schools.
